1. I purchased the Accounting Antics Set from FunTeaching.com. The address is PO Box 94474, Albuquerque, NM 87199-4474. This set includes 10 CDs that include games for various areas of accounting. The areas covered are: Accounting Trivia, Accounting Around Us, About Transactions, Posting and Statements, Banking Your Money, Payroll Accounting, Merchandise Accounting, More Merchandise Accounting, and Cool Career Planning.
